The Gospel reading sets the stage for Pentecost. Prior to giving us the full gift of his Spirit, Jesus provides the gift of peace, the gift of his heart. A supermatural gift, it per stage of the stage

pernatural gift, it penetrates deep into our own hearts. It is the calming presence of Christ when we face challenges and difficulties.

Jesus bestowed it upon his first apostles twice in the same meeting shortly after his resurrection. Then he gave them the life-breath of God, the Holy Spirit, and commissioned them with the priesthood of forgiving the sins of others — another gift that brings peace.

This gift of peace has been distributed by Jesus ever since, through the ordained priesthood in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. And to hold us steady in our efforts to remain holy, Jesus gives us the breath of God. This breath,

this life-sustaining presence of God's Spirit, which created the world and keeps us spiritually alive, is the Holy Spirit – God's holiness activating us and dwelling within us.

Whatever is not holy – not of the Spirit – is sinful and destructive. Jesus, who is the embodiment of Divine Mercy, died on the cross and gave us his Spirit so that we could live in the forgiveness of God.

When you pray the "Our Father", do it slowly and inten-

tionally. During the words, "forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us," think of people who have irritated you or hurt you without remorse. Consciously forgive them.

Otherwise, your unforgiveness could affect their eternal souls as well as your own, because you're denying them an opportunity to understand God's forgiveness through your example, and you're denying God the opportunity to forgive you for your sin of unforgiveness.

Forgiveness doesn't mean approving of the sin nor forgetting. It means letting go of the desire to retaliate. It means choosing to love whether it's deserved or not. It means entering anew into Christ's gift of peace.

Reflect & Discuss:

- 1. Who in your life is hardest to forgive? Perhaps yourself! What sins are you retaining by refusing to accept that God has already made his forgiveness available? What are you going to do to let go of the unforgiveness?
- 2. Name a situation that illustrates the resurrection power of forgiveness. How did the Holy Spirit help make forgiveness easier?
- 3. What changed when forgiveness was given? How did this bring the kingdom of God to earth?

Along with learning ABC's and 123's, the preschool and pre-kindergarten have been busy doing a free community library station, a coat drive, collecting can tabs for the Ronald McDonald House, and collecting tabs for Danielle Cares (free wheelchairs for children).

work together as a team and practice playing the way God wants us to do. One day they decided to work together to clean up a center more quickly. It worked. The teacher was sure to praise the class for working together! There are days that they have class outside.

Our first and second graders have been focusing shard on reading and math skills. Along with this, whey have completed some special projects this year. A couple of their favorite activities were to learn about dinosaurs and make a model of their favorite one. They also had the opportunity to design and make their own musical instruments while learning about sound.

The third and fourth grade students have researched and created models of habitats, planets, animals, and organ systems. They also enjoy several novel studies, including: The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe by C. S. Lewis, Charlotte's Web by E. B. White, and Stone Fox by John Reynolds Gardiner.

The fifth and sixth graders have been focusing on improving their vocabulary. Each morning they have enjoyed learning Latin roots and recognizing those roots in words they use by using their vocabulary words when writing essays or reports. Most recently they have explored careers and created posters telling about those careers using their vocabulary words. While preparing for Confirmation, the students have become more aware of faith in actions and the presence of God in all aspects of their lives.

Also, very busy this year are our seventh and eighth graders. They have been honing their writing skills. This includes writing several different essay types; compare/contrast, informational, persuasive, and narrative pieces. They also had Confirmation on March 19th. During Lent, they performed in a Live Stations Play for the school.
