Members of St. Mary's School Board met on Wednesday, September 25th, 2019 at 7:05 p.m. in the Rectoryconference room. Present were: Father Matt, Adam Boman, Andrew Eckhart, Jason Kramer, Amber Heidlage-Cole and Jennifer Garner and teacher, Sierrah Summers. Fares Masriwas absent.

In Fares Masri's absence, the meeting was called to order by Vice-President Adam Boman.

Opening prayer was led by Father Matt.

Minutes of last meeting were reviewed. Jennifer Garner moved to approve minutes, Adam Boman2nd the motion. Motion passed.

Finance Report

Finance report for the month was reviewed. Mr. Kramer reports to date, \$54,000 has been collected for tuition. Approximately \$50,000 remains outstanding. At first quarter, he plans to send a reminder to those families who have not yet paid. Adam Boman moved to approve minutes, Jennifer Garner 2nd motion. Motion passed.

Father's Report

- Father reported he is both "pleased and impressed" with the school masses and the children's participation in the celebration.
- He was pleased with the turnout for the first Home and School meeting and is looking forward to the activities during the year.
- He noted teachers are bringing him ideas and seeking input for students in religion class. He specifically noted All Saint's Day and the
 rosary during the month of October.

- He would like and appreciate feedback on activities the school is hosting. There are severalupcoming activities planned:

 - o Bring your bible to school day, living rosary, and celebration of godparents
 - o Halloween carnival
- There was a fair turn out for the all-school mass. He anticipates spacing out the celebrations at both St. Agnes and SS. Peter and Paul.
- Sister Cecilia made a visit to the school and was happy with what she saw.
- Parent/Teacher conferences and diocesan meeting are scheduled October 17 and 18, respectively.
- Ultimately, he wants the school to decrease the burden on the church, working toward more financial stability.
 - Brief discussion regarding a tuition increase for next year, but this will be put on hold until the diocese sends out the cost of living increase in the spring.
- I-Ready Assessments
 - o First year implementing these tests. Preliminary results obtained in both reading and math,
 - These tests provide good data as they are both easier to break down and understand. They gauge students toward the end of the year and progress can be monitored.
 - o Red indicates 2 or more grades levels below current level, yellow indicates approaching grade level, and green means a student is at or above grade level.
 - o Reading Results: Seeing good things without many red areas. Deficits are starting to be addressed.
 - o Math: Decreased green, more yellow. Seeking improvements in this area.
- Website: No updates.

Old Business

- Adam Boman reported on Mercy Monday; will be meeting in the next couple of weeks to discuss.
 - Looking at a November or December project, possibly working with a missionary or food bank.
 - Would like to make Camp Barnabas an annual project.


Saturday December 7 St. Ambrose Isaiah 30:19-21,23-26 Ps 147:1-6 Matthew 9:35--10:1,5-8 Hope is the theme of the First Sunday of Advent. Isaiah describes a future in which all is well because (1) God is recognized as the highest authority and (2) obeying him is the people's highest priority.

This vision gave great hope to the oppressed Israelites. Today if we look at this as a description of heaven, it gives great hope to us, too. When we die, "terms" will be "imposed" upon us (i.e., purgatory) because we did not stay entirely on the paths of God, but we will be living in the light of the Lord after death and there will be no more wars to battle.

Knowing that this is our future, we can look at our present trials as preparations for heaven. The weapons that we use now to defeat and overcome the powers of darkness can be used as plowshares for enriching our soil (our earthly life), bringing us into new growth and producing a harvest in ministry. Sufferings that are turned into

ministries to help others make hardships very valuable.

Although Isaiah was speaking of the coming of the world's Messiah through the Jews, these verses remind us that when we respect God's authority and make imitating Christ our highest priority, all is well for us. Our battles against evil aren't over yet, but Jesus has already won the victory for us. Our hope is not based on a wish for peace; our hope comes from the reality of what Jesus has already done and what he will do. So,



"let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord!" (Psalm 122).

The Gospel reading tells us that our hope is realized only if we stay awake and alert to the activities of Christ. What are you despairing about? Despair and worry are merely distractions that make us forget that Christ has already won the battle. If we stay alert to the presence of Christ, recognizing his authority and following his ways, we live in hope – not wishful thinking, but a hope that's based firmly on reality.

Reflect & Discuss:

- 1. What are you despairing about?
- 2. What would it take for you to feel hopeful? In what way do you need Jesus to come to you now? What can you do to become more aware of his presence at your side?
- 3. How do you find hope in difficulties?
- 4. Describe a time when you nearly lost all hope. How did Jesus rescue you from this?
