5th Sunday of Lent

Saturday April 4 Ezekiel 37:21-28 Jer 31:10-13 John 11:45-56 Lent is not about suffering and sacrifice. It's a corridor to new life. Good Friday is not about pain and death. It's the door that Jesus opens to invite us into that new life.

Yes, suffering is part of the Lenten journey (which can be experienced at any time of the year). Yes, Lent includes the sacrifices of fasting and abstinence, almsgiving and extra time in church. But these are just vehicles for the trip.

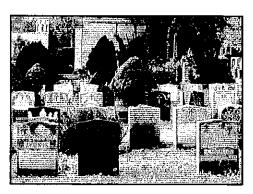
God uses our sufferings (if we let him) to help us grow in compassion, persistence, and ministry. Our sacrifices teach us discipline (which is discipleship) so that we can purify our will and grow stronger in holiness. But the trip is not the destination.

Lent is all about reaching the resurrection: renewing our faith, entering a new life free of old sins, reconciling damaged relationships, and living

in the Spirit of God more than we ever did before.

Which day is more important to your faith: Good Friday or Easter? That horrid day on Calvary was necessary for Easter, but we are living in the resurrection! Catholics are an Easter people. This means that nothing bad can ever happen to us that will not be transformed into blessings if Jesus is the Lord of our lives.

He proved himself to be the Resurrection and the Life by displaying his power over life and death. Now he wants to prove it again – to you and to all those who are watching.



Reflect & Discuss:

- We can personalize the first reading by understanding that God will open our graves (whatever is dead inside of us) and will place his Spirit of Life within us. How does the Holy Spirit help us discover healing and hope amidst daily sufferings?
- 2. In the scripture from Romans, we are reminded again of the Holy Spirit within us. Since the Spirit is alive in you, what affect does this have on your Lenten journey? What is being purified, strengthened, and renewed?
- 3. In the Gospel, Jesus proves his power over death just before he enters Jerusalem and heads toward Calvary. How does this prove to you that your own sufferings and sacrifices will not lead to permanent disaster?

Lenten Activity:

What needs to be resurrected in your life? What will you do this week to accept the death of what has ended so that you can prepare for the new life that Jesus is preparing for you?

FROM FR. MATT.

WE ARE ENTERING INTO THE SECOND WEEK OF WHAT IS BEING CALLED SOCIAL DISTANCING, AS WE ENTER INTO THE FIFTY WEEK OF LENT. I AM PRAYING THAT THE SEMI QUARANTINE WILL BE LIFTED VERY SOON. THE SEPARATION FROM YOU AT MASS IS ALMOST UNBEARABLE, NOT JUST BECAUSE IT IS A MATTER THAT I DON'T GET TO PROVIDE YOU WITH THE OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE CARE OF SOME OF YOUR TEMPORAL PUNISHMENT VIA SERMON. IT IS BECAUSE, AT THE CONSECRATION DURING MASS, YOU ARE CHRIST'S MOTHER, MARY, HER SISTER, MARY THE WIFE OF CLOPAS, MARY MAGDALINE AND THE BELOVED DISCIPLE, JOHN, WHO ARE AT THE FOOT OF THE CROSS. NOT HAVING YOU PRESENT IS A MULTIPLICATION OF THE AGONY OF CRUCIFIXION SUFFERED IN SAYING MASS.

FOR ALL OF US THERE IS A WITNESS OF THE THREE HOURS OF DARKNESS THAT CAME OVER THE LAND, FROM NOON UNTIL THREE. MT. 27:45 THIS IS A SHARING IN THE SUFFERINGS OF CHRIST. IT IS GENERALLY BEFORE US IN THE MASS, EXPERIENCED IN THE DEPTHS OF OUR SOULS, BUT THIS LENT, THERE HAS BEEN A PHYSICAL ASPECT ADDED. PRAY IN THESE THREE HOURS OF DARKNESS, UNITED TO CHRIST SUFFERING AND DYING. IT WILL BRING ABOUT A GREATER SHARE IN HIS RESURRECTION. WHO WOULD HAVE THOUGHT IT WOULD COME ABOUT IN THIS WAY AT THIS TIME?

PLEASE REMEMBER TO TAKE THE TIME TO UNITE YOURSELF TO OTHERS IN PRAYER IT IS DONE VIA THE SIGN OF THE CROSS AT THE BEGINNING OF PRAYER, AND SPIRITUALLY PLACING YOURSELF IN CHURCH WITH YOUR FELLOW PARISHIONERS (AS WELL AS YOUR PRIEST) WHO LOVE YOU WITH THE HEART OF CHRIST. WE ARE TOGETHER SPIRITUALLY IN PRAYER. I KNOW IT IS NOT THE SAME. WE DO AS WE CAN. IT IS A LONGING FOR RESURRECTION. IF AVAILABLE, TAKING ADVANTAGE MASS ON TV, OR VIA WEB ETC., IS A GIFT. PLEASE REMEMBER THE ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION, NOT JUST SUNDAY, DAILY! OF COURSE, AS I MENTIONED, IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT ONE REMEMBER TO MAKE THE PERFECT ACT OF CONTRITION BEFORE HAND. AS AN ACT OF CHARITY TO THOSE WHO ARE SUFFERING THE RAVAGES OF THE VIRUS, THE POPE HAS ASKED FOR US TO PRAY THE ROSARY FOR THEM AND FOR THOSE WHO ARE WORKING TO ALLEVIATE THE SUFFERINGS OF THOSE AFFLICTED. HE HAS DECLARED THE GRANTING OF A PLENARY INDULGENCE TO THOSE WHO DO SO. THE ORDINARY CONDITIONS APPLY, THE VARIANT BEING, ACT OF CONTRITION MAY BE SUBSTITUTED FOR CONFESSION, UNTIL ONE IS ABLE TO MAKE CONFESSION, SPIRITUAL COMMUNION IS SUFFICIENT UNTIL SACRAMENTAL COMMUNION MAY BE RECEIVED. IT IS NECESSARY THOUGH TO BE INTERIORLY DETACHED FROM ALL SIN, EVEN VENIAL. ONE MAY GAIN THE INDULGENCE ONCE A DAY. AN INDULGENCE MAY BE APPLIED TO ONE'S SELF OR FOR THE DEPARTED.

A FURTHER REMINDER. THE BISHOP HAS DIRECTED THAT CONFESSIONS BE DONE BY APPOINTMENT. IF IT IS YOUR DESIRE TO RECEIVE THE SACRAMENT, GIVE ME A CALL. THE SAME APPLIES TO THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK. AS I HAVE SAID MANY TIMES AT MASS, I DON'T WANT MY PEOPLE TO GO TO SURGERY OR SERIOUS ILLNESS WITHOUT THE GRACE OF THE SACRAMENT. IF YOU CAN'T GET TO ME, I'LL GET TO YOU.

IN THE MEANTIME, KNOW THAT I HAVE TAKEN IT TO MYSELF TO SAY ONE "OUR FATHER," ONE "HAIL MARY," AND THE "GLORY BE...." FOR EACH MEMBER OF THE PARISH. AS MY MOM OFTEN SAYS, "THERE IS METHOD IN THE MADNESS OR MADNESS IN THE METHOD!" HERE IT IS. EACH OF YOU IS SAYING AN ACT OF CONTRITION. FOR THE TIME BEING, IT IS DEEMED SUFFICIENT FOR CONFESSION. WHEN ONE COMES TO ME FOR THAT SACRAMENT, I GENERALLY ASSIGN A PENANCE CONSISTING OF, ONE OUR FATHER AND ONE HAIL MARY FOR THE GOOD OF THE CHURCH. (IF YOU SHOOT MY MOM, YOU MIGHT GET 100 ROSARIES TO SAY - LESSON: DON'T SHOOT MY MOM!) IT IS MY PRACTICE TO SAY THE SAME PENANCE FOR THE PERSON(S) TO WHOM I ASSIGN THE PENANCE BEFORE I GO TO SLEEP. I DON'T KNOW OR CARE IF ANY OTHER PRIEST DOES THIS, I DO. I MUST BE WITH YOU IN PENANCE.

ONE OF THE GREAT UNFORSEEN BENEFITS THAT CAME OUT OF THE RECENT NEW PARISH PICTURE DIRECTORIES AND UPDATED HISTORY THAT MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL OF CATHOLIC WOMEN WORKED SO HARD TO BRING TO US IS THAT I HAVE A PRETTY ACCURATE LIST. COURSE I WILL THROW A FEW EXTRA, JUST FOR THE SAKE OF THE GOOD OF ALL.
