## Solemnity of the Holy Trinity

Saturday June 13 St. Anthony of Padua 1 Kings 19:19-21 Ps 16:1b-2a,5,7-10 Matthew 5:33-37 On the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate and honor God's character as the Most Holy Trinity.

The first reading shows us the Father parenting the baby nation of Israel. We see that he is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and rich in kindness and faithfulness" — the Perfect Father.

If we have difficulty seeing him this way, it's because we've never experienced a human father-figure showed us what perfect fatherhood looks like. Our spirits need healing. We've been projecting human imperfections onto our image of God. Even the best parents and teachers fall short of the wonderfulness of God's fatherhood. We need to consciously differentiate him from our human dads and other human authorities.

The second reading shows us the entire Trinity: the grace

of Jesus, the love of the Father, and our friendly partnership with the Holy Spirit. In this and because of this, we are to rejoice, mend our ways, and live in peace with one another.

In other words, because Jesus bore our sins as he died on the cross and then conquered death, he provides us with grace so that we can resist sin, and he provides us with the Father's love so that we can love one another no matter what, and he provides us with the Holy Spirit,



who fellowships with us and empowers us so that we can continually live as holy Christians.

The Gospel reading shows us the depth of the Father's love. He doesn't condemn us for our sins; he gives us his Son to rescue us from the destructive results of our sins.

Our sins condemn us and sentence us to eternal death, but Jesus saves us from this by taking us to eternal life – if we want him to!

### Reflect & Discuss:

- Which Person of the Trinity do you know the least? Or feel distant from? Or fear?
- 2. How have human relationships interfered with your ability to feel God's closeness?
- 3. Which Person of the Trinity do you know best? Why?
- 4. How is the Trinity the perfect example of a good, loving, healthy relationship?

I AM NOT VERY LIKELY TO WRITE TOO MUCH THEOLOGICAL IN THIS PARTICULAR ENTRY. AS I HAVE MENTIONED IN SERMONS OVER THE YEARS, EVERFY TIME ONE TRIES TO PRESENT A THEOLOGICAL TREATISE ON THE TRINITY, ONE FINDS HIMSELF WITHIN AN INCH OF HERESY. I AM GOING TO SAVE GREAT BULK OF WHAT THERE IS TO SAY FOR THE SERMON AT MASS. SUFFICIENT TO SAY THAT, SINCE WE ARE MADE IN THE IMAGE AND LIKENESS OF GOD, EACH OF US IN SOME WAY REFLECTS THE GLORY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY.

WITH THE RESTRICTED NUMBERS OF PEOPLE ALLOWED IN CHURCH BEING THE ORDER OF THE DAY FOR THE TIME BEING, THERE IS IN DEVELOPMENT AN ALTERNATIVE TO VIEWING MASS ON TV. IT IS BEING DONE IN VIEW OF THE POSSIBILITY OF MORE PEOPLE COMING HERE THAN CAN BE HELD IN THE CHURCH UNDER CURRENT RESTRICTIONS. WITHING THE NEXT FEW WEEKS,, WE WILL HAVE A SET UP FOR THOSE WHO MAY WISH TO LISTEN TO MASS HERE AT ST. MARY'S ON THEIR CAR RADIOS WHILE PARKED IN OUR LOT. BASICALLY, THERE WILL BE A VERY LOW POWER RADIO TRANSMITTER PLUMBED INTO THE SOUND SYSTEM OF THE CHURCH. IT CAN BE SET TO TRANSMIT ON A FREQUENCY THAT IS NOT USED IN THE AREA, SO THERE WILL BE NO INTERFERENCE WITH COMMERCIAL BROADCAST. AS IS THE CASE WITH WATCHING MASS ON TELEVISION, THE ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION IS TO BE USED AT THE TIME OF COMMUNION, UNLESS THE BISHOP GIVES A BLANKET DISPENSATION FOR THE PRACTICE OF THOSE WHO LISTEN BE ABLE TO COME INTO CHURCH AFTER MASS IS OVER TO RECEIVE.

RELATED TO THE PREVIOUS COMMENT ON A DISPENSATION FOR COMMUNION, I HAVE BEEN TOLD BY A NUMBER OF PEOPLE THAT THEY HAVE HEARD THAT IN BOTH SPRINGFIELD AND JOPLIN, COMMUNION IS BEING DISTRIBUTED IN THE CHURCH PARKING LOTS. AS ABOVE, BEFORE I CAN CONSIDER DOING THAT HERE AT ST. MARY'S AND AT ST. AGNES, WOULD HAVE TO HAVE THE PERMISSION OF THE BISHOP. IT FALLS UNDER HIS OFFICE TO GRANT SUCH, I WILL LOOK INTO THE POSSIBILITY. IF HE IS AMENABLE TO IT, I AM OF THE MIND THAT IT COULD START TO HAPPEN WHEN I RETURN FROM VACATION IN MID JULY.

ON THE TOPIC OF MY VACATION: I WANT TO THANK FR. PAUL McLOUGHLIN FOR FILLING IN FOR ME WHILE I GO WEST TO REMIND MY MOTHER THAT THE PAINS SHE WENT THROUGH IN GIVING BIRTH TO ME WERE SIMPLY A HARBINGER OF THE PAIN TO COME IN HAVINGG ME AS HER CHILD FOR ALL THESE YEARS.
