Are you at an impasse in your spiritual growth or emotional healing or a difficult relationship? Do you need a breakthrough? Do you feel stuck behind a fence that's keeping you on the outside of peace, joy, satisfaction, or healing?

This Sunday's Gospel reading tells us that Jesus is the gate in that fence. He helps us reach the heavenly side of the gate, outside the realm of earthly restrictions — not only when we die and enter eternal life, but also here and now in our earthly life, so that we might always "have life and have it more abundantly."

When our path seems blocked, we can only make progress by letting Jesus shepherd us around and through and over the obstacles. If people shut a door on

something that God wants us to do, Jesus is still our open gate and no one can close him out of our lives. He will lead us into a new opportunity for accomplishing the plans of God. If he's given us a frustrated holy desire or a passion for which there seems to be no outlet, instead of complaining or quitting, we must look at Jesus and see him as a gate that opens into a new direction or location.

Remember, however, that until we get all the way through this gate, we must stick close to him like dumb



sheep. There's a journey to take before we can reach the other side of the fence.

The thief that comes to steal and slaughter can only reach us when we stray away from Jesus and we take our eyes off of him.

Despair and worry are two common thieves, robbing us of peace, joy, satisfaction, and healing. But they're not as powerful as they

pretend to be. We defeat them easily by remembering that they do not speak the full truth. The truth is: Jesus is our Good Shepherd safely guiding us into a life of abundant victory!

Reflect & Discuss:

1. What breakthrough are you hoping for? What's frustrating you and seems hopeless? What's causing you to think that a problem you're facing might lead to disaster and destruction?
2. What will you do this week to follow Jesus more closely so that you can get through this with more peace?
3. Share the story of a time when you experienced obstacles and Jesus provided a breakthrough that led to victory.

THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

FROM THE PASTOR

I KNOW THAT THIS WILL SOUND A BIT OUT OF CHARACTER, BUT AT THIS MOMENT, I REALLY DON'T HAVE MUCH TO SAY. THE LIKELY REASON IS THAT WRITING IS DIFFERENT THAN SPEAKING. ONE OF THE THINGS THAT WAS DRILLED INTO MY HEAD OVER TOO MANY YEARS OF EDUCATION THAT ONE'S WRITING SHOULD NOT BE THE SAME AS ONE'S SPEECH.

THAT BEING SAID, I MUST SAY THAT IT IS A SHAME THAT I AM AT SOMETHING OF A LOSS FOR WORDS, SINCE THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF THE EASTER SEASON ALWAYS REVOLVES AROUND THE THEME OF CHRIST, THE GOOD SHEPHERD. ALTHOUGH YOU ARE AWARE THAT I DON'T MUCH LIKE THE IMAGE OF THE FAITHFUL AS SHEEP, THERE IS MUCH MORE TO THE IMAGE THAN THAT. THE DEPTH OF THE IMAGE OF GOOD SHEPHERD IS ONE THAT VERY MUCH BRINGS TOGETHER ALL THE ASPECTS OF THE EASTER SEASON. CHRIST, RISEN FROM THE DEAD, HAVING SACRIFICED HIS LIFE TO BRING US THROUGH DEATH TO LIFE, SHARING ETERNAL LIFE WITH HIS PEOPLE THROUGH BAPTISM, NOURISHING US WITH AND THROUGH HIS PRESENCE IN THE EUCHARIST UNTIL THE END OF TIME THROUGH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CHURCH, FOUNDED ON THE APOSTLES WITH PETER AS HEAD. HE IS ALWAYS WITH US, AND HIS SALVIFIC WORK IS PRESENT TO US, WITH US IN EVERY MOMENT OF OUR LIVES. IT IS A REALITY THAT UNITES THE TEMPORAL TO THE ETERNAL. A REALITY REFLECTED IN THE TEACHING OF THE CHURCH CONCERNING THE UNBROKEN AND UNBREAKABLE CONNECTION BETWEEN THE CHURCH MILITANT (ON EARTH) AND THE CHURCH TRIUMPHANT (IN HEAVEN).. I AM FULLY AWARE THAT I GO ON ABOUT THIS A BIT TOO MUCH AT TIMES, BUT IT IS BASIS OF THE REALITY THAT THE GOOD THAT WE DO IN THIS WORLD IS A PART OF THE ETERNAL LIFE OF HEAVEN. IT IS A CONSEQUENCE OF UNITY WITH CHRIST, THE GOOD SHEPHERD, WHO LEADS HIS PEOPLE THROUGH LIFE INTO EVERLASTING LIFE BY SHARING WITH US THE CALL AND OPPORTUNITIES TO BRING THE ETERNAL INTO THE TEMPORAL. THE FOURTH WEEK OF EASTER IS A TIME WHEN WE ARE CALLED TO REFLECT A LITTLE ON HOW THAT HAPPENS IN OUR LIVES, WORKING WITH THE GRACE OF GOD, THROUGH THE INSPIRATION OF THE HOLY SPIRIT TO BRING ABOUT THE GLIMPSES OF THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN THAT GOD TRUSTS US TO DO. I AM OF A MIND THAT IS ENOUGH OF THAT FOR NOW.

IF ONE IS FOLLOWING THE NEWS, WE ARE AWARE THAT THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE IS GOING TO BE TALKING ABOUT, "OPENING THINGS BACK UP." HE HAS SAID THAT HE WILL BE PRESENTING NEW GUIDELINES AND PROVIDING SOME DIRECTION CONCERNING PUBLIC WORSHIP. THAT CERTAINLY IS A HOPEFUL STATEMENT. IT WILL BE UP TO THE BISHOPS IN THE STATE TO COME UP WITH THE PRACTICAL APPLICATION OF THAT DIRECTION. WE WILL SEE HOW THAT ALL WORKS OUT. ALTHOUGH IT MAY SOUND STUPID TO SOME, I AM HOPING THAT WE CAN GET BACK TO MASS BY THE TIME THE PEONIES ARE IN BLOOM. I WOULD HATE TO SEE THE MAJORITY US MISS THE BEAUTY AND GLORY OF

NATURE, WHICH REFLECTS THE GLORY OF CHRIST'S REDEMPTIVE ACT, PRESENT TO US IN THE MASS. JUST IN CASE YOU MISSED IT, THAT IS MY FEEBLE ATTEMPT FOR THE WEEK TO BE POETIC. THAT IS AS GOOD A PLACE AS ANY TO STOP, LEST A GREATER EVIL BEFALL US. GOD BLESS - FR. MATT.
