ST. MARY'S HOME & SCHOOL SCRIP PROGRAM: Shopwithscrip.com Scrip is simply a word that means "substitute money"-in other words, scrip is gift certificates from national and local retailers. They're the same gift certificates that you buy at the store. Many popular retailers participate in our scrip program. The way that we make our money off of the program is by these retailers offering the cards through Scrip at a discount. This means that when you pay face value for the card, i.e. \$25 will get you a \$25 gift card Scrip will charge is a reduced amount to buy that card. The reduced amount varies widely depending on the participating retailer. On line you can see the % we earn on each retailer's card, but you can also contact me at anytime if you have any questions. Using the Scrip program is simple and easy, it just requires planning ahead before you will be visiting your favorite stores and restaurants. The reason for planning ahead is because we may not place a order every week. If you would like your orders to be sent home with your child from school or left at school to be picked up, please note that on your enrollment form (in the back of church). We also have Wal-mart, Casey's, Town & Country, Academy, Visa, Discover, Lowe's, Kohl's, Acambaro, Starbucks, Subway and Dairy Queen cards available for purchase anytime in the school office. You don't have to be a school family to participate in this great program. This helps the school, so please enroll and enjoy the ease of paying for things with your scrip cards!!

½ of the money raised each year in the Scrip program goes to Home & School. Each family has control over the other ½ of the money their rebates earned. They can choose for that money to go to one of the following 3 places.

- 1. The Next School Year Tuition for student (Preschool-8)
- 2. The Next School Year Operating Costs of the School
- 3. Home & School

### St. Mary's Parish Council Meeting Minutes Wednesday, August/12<sup>th</sup>, 2020

Members present were: Father Matt, Joe Crowell, Judy Flehmer, Mike Kaiser, Bonnie Parrigon, Jim Randall, and Cody Washam. The meeting was called to order by Cody Washam.

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Father Matt.

The minutes from the last meeting were read by Secretary Bonnie Parrigon and approved by the Council.

The Financial Report was given by Joe Crowell. He reported the end of the year fiscal report had a balanced budget all the way around. The PPP money of \$62, 500 for the church, school, and the cafeteria was a great help. Without it we would have been about \$60,000 under what we are. Hopefully this PPP money will be forgiven.

Father Matt's Report: Father mentioned our mission is rebuilding, restoration, and improving following the shut-down. This has challenges as things are slowly opening. We've got to see ourselves called to a greater presence.

### Old Business

- The right equipment to repair the chimney on the church has not been found yet.
- Cody will look at the walls going up to the choir to see what we truly need.
- The parking lot work has been completed. Several parishioners helped. Thank you.
- The security in the church was discussed. A meeting with the ushers is still being planned. Mike Kaiser reported that Bonnie Witt-Schulte will be discussing with him about storm procedures.
- Father Matt asked that everyone extend their time on Parish Council for one more year. We will wait until next spring to discuss this.
- The tuck pointing on the church was discussed. Father Matt has contacted a company in Iowa. He mentioned part of the job would involve fixing the chimney. No decision has been made on hiring this company. He also contacted Dr. Gene Aug, who gave Father the name of a company. He is waiting for them to call him back.

### **New Business**

- School starts Aug. 20<sup>th</sup>. Substitutes are needed.
- With all that has gone on with Covid, etc. it is important for all of us to volunteer and ask other parishioners to help with things around the church.
- A dinner fundraiser is being planned for Nov. 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020. A raffle will also be held. Dinner tickets are available to purchase ahead of time. Father's hope is that having this will get people together.
- We are hoping to get church assignments for readers and ushers back to normal soon.
- We need to make sure we use social media to portray Father Matt's message to parishioners since there is still fear and church attendance is down.
- The next meeting was set for September 9, 2020.

The meeting was closed with prayer.

1 Corinth 15:35-37,42-49 Ps 56:10c-14 Luke 8:4-15 Jesus' message in this Sunday's Gospel reading explains a line from the "Our Father" prayer he had taught earlier (Matthew 6:12): "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us."

The strongest word here is "AS" – the same as, just like, in equal measure.

If there is anyone we have not forgiven, if there is anyone we cannot pray for with love, we'd better keep our mouths shut during this part of the prayer to our Father, who is the Father of all.

Sometimes, it's difficult to forgive because we think "forgiving" means "forgetting". Jesus never said that we must forget what the debtor owes. Forgiveness means remembering — and learning from the memory — without demanding repayment or retribution.

Unforgiveness is a form of punishment: it's payback time. For example, if we remain angry, we hope that our anger or coldness will somehow punish the sinner into re-

pentance. Well, guess what. That never works.

Here's something else we do that never works: holding a grudge to protect ourselves from getting hurt again. Grudges do not free us from the pain of bad memories. It chains us to them.



When we free others from the debts they owe us for hurting us (whether they seek it or not, whether they're still alive or not), we free ourselves and our healing begins – our healing!

It's the most loving gift that we can give to ourselves, as it's a gift of love to others. Even when they don't recognize our gift, God does.

#### Reflect & Discuss:

- 1. Who angers you because they don't deserve your forgiveness?
- 2. What are you gaining from unforgiveness and resentment? What will you lose if you forgive?
- 3. What is the most difficult part of forgiveness?
- 4. What steps do you take for pushing yourself into truly letting go of unforgiveness so you can find healing? Sharing this with others will spread good ideas that could change someone's life!
