What is the purpose of church choir?

The church choir is important not only because it **sings worship songs**, it is most important because it **Leads the congregation to sing worship songs**. It invites other church members into singing.

My questions to you are this: Did you miss the music and singing during the pandemic when it was not allowed? Did it feel as if something was missing at Mass? Did you feel like you did not go away with the same contentment of spending time with God when you went home from a Mass with silent spots that did not have any singing? I know for myself the answers are all YES!! I definitely could feel the difference in a mass without music.

The regular number in the choir has dwindled down to 7. The choir and organist at St Mary's are inviting you to join us to sing. We need anyone in the church with the love or need for singing to join us. We do not expect anyone to be a professional or even consider themselves good, you just need to have the love of praising God in song and helping lead our congregation to worship God. The more voices, the more we all blend together and the better we sound. Young, old, Moms, Dads, Kids, Grannies, Grandads...... make it a family affair. We are all better together. We are not asking for a weekly commitment or endless practices. Just join us in singing praise when you are at Mass at St Mary's. We also, need anyone that would like to play the organ or can already play. There is a very limited number of church members talented enough to play it. If you feel you might be interested, please join us now to create a beautiful worship of our Lord for the Christmas season and see if it is something you will enjoy doing year-round. We will begin practicing for Advent and Christmas choir in a couple of weeks. It will be on Tuesday nights for a few weeks until Christmas. We do seasonal practices again prior to Lent and Easter. These are the only times through the year that we practice other than special events such as Confirmation, First Communion etc.

Singing helps us to remember God's word. If the Word of Christ is to dwell in us deeply, we have to remember it. Singing helps us to respond to God's grace. Music is an emotional language. Singing helps us to reflect God's glory. The glory God receives through our songs actually goes beyond the words we sing. Singing has always played an **important part** in Christian worship. Jesus himself sang a hymn with the disciples at the Last Supper (Matthew 26:30). All told, the Bible contains over four hundred **references to singing** and fifty direct commands to sing. In the New Testament we're commanded not once, but twice, to sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to one another when we meet....**Ephesians 5:19** ... speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the LORD**Corinthians 3:16** Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts.**Psalms 100:1-2** - Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all ye lands. **Psalms 95:1-2** - O come, let us sing unto the LORD: let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation. **Psalm 13:6** 6 I will sing the LORD 's praise, for he has been good to me.


Romans 16:3-9,16,22-27 Ps 145:2-5,10-11 Luke 16:9-15 In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus asserted the two greatest commands of the Law, quoting from the ancient Hebrew scriptures, which we have in the first reading. And the

second reading, from the New Testament letter to the Hebrews, explains how the Law of Love supersedes or fulfills all other laws. Jesus, who loved perfectly and never sinned against anyone, sacrificed himself for sinners. Therefore, we who want to follow him to heaven need to follow in his footsteps of love, by loving God and everyone else whole-heartedly.

Try as we might, though, we love imperfectly; we sin. The best penance, then, is an act of love, especially if it's a sacrifice offered to (or for) those who were harmed by our sin. But the damage we've caused has a ripple effect that goes far beyond anything we can see. This is remedied in the Catholic Church's Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus -- through the priest -- ac-

cepts our remorse and absolves our sins, while the entire earthly Body of Christ (the Church) -- through the priest -- accepts our penances for the earthly damage that our sins have caused.

Penance is not only an act of love, it's designed to strengthen our resolve to choose love when tempted to sin again. If the priest gives us an easy penance (for example, "Say the Lord's Prayer and three Hail Marys"), if we really want to become holier, we should ask God



during those three Hail Marys for a penance that's a more difficult act of love. We should choose a sacrifice, something that requires loving God with our whole heart, soul, and mind as well as loving ourselves and our neighbors just as much.

Saint Anthony Mary Claret said, "The love of Christ arouses us, urges us to run, and to fly, lifted on the wings of holy zeal." How high is your love flying? Zeal is a good measuring instrument of how much we love God.

Reflect & Discuss:

- Whom have you loved imperfectly this week?
- What act of penance could you do that would be an exercise in loving them better, treating them the way Jesus would? When will you complete the reconciliation through the sacraments of the Church?
- What does "zeal" mean? Name some of the ways that we love God with zeal.
- 4. Tell the story of a time when you made a sacrifice because of love. How did this reveal Jesus to others?
