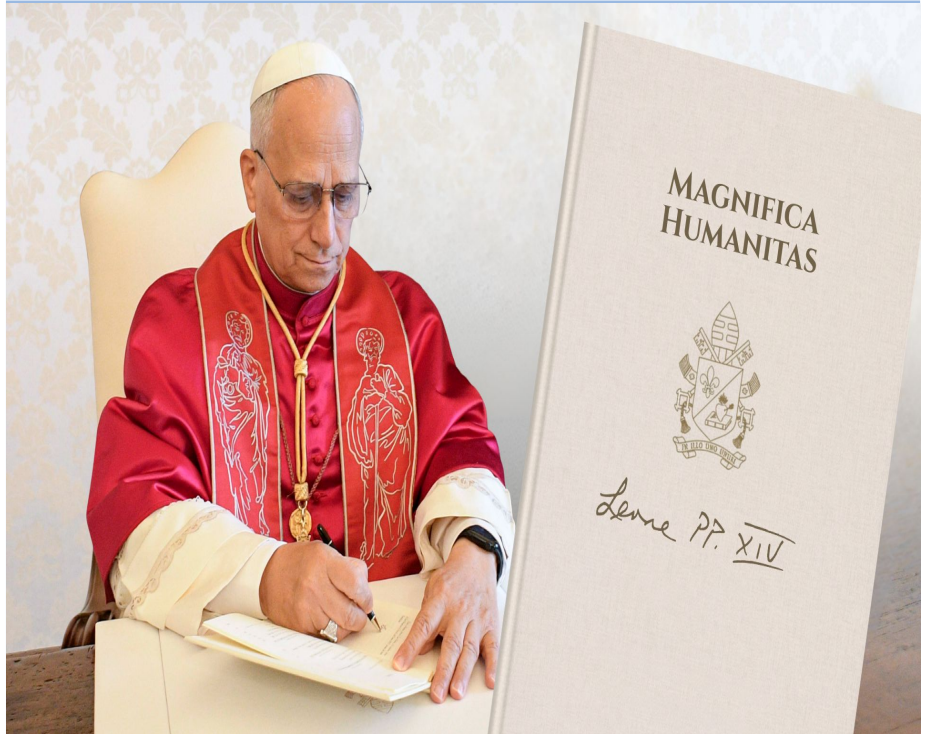

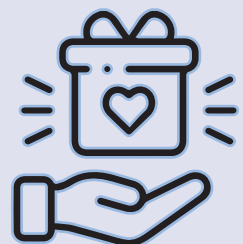

MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS-

"Magnificent Humanity" is the first encyclical of Pope Leo XIV, subtitled "On Safeguarding the Human Person in the Time of Artificial Intelligence." Signed on May 15, 2026 (the 135th anniversary of Rerum Novarum), it was released to the public on May 25. The encyclical is not just a technical analysis of AI, but a broader reflection applying Catholic Social Teaching to our era. It frames technology as not inherently good or evil, but never neutral—it carries the values of its creators.

Key Themes: Human Dignity &

Transhumanism: It argues human life has a God-given dignity beyond utility, efficiency, or productivity. It firmly warns that "progress" should not mean surpassing the human condition, but must include frailty as a place where grace enters. **The Common Good &**

Digital Colonialism: It warns against a new form of "colonialism" where a small elite controls data and algorithms, calling for patents, algorithms, and data to be recognized as goods universally intended for all. **Specific**

Harms: It specifically addresses job automation, surveillance, digital manipulation, AI in warfare, and massive propaganda networks. **"Disarming" AI:** The Pope calls for "disarming" artificial intelligence, freeing it from military and economic competition logics and preventing it from dominating humanity. (its summary, read the encyclical for the better understanding)
